
#### Hearing and Vision Screenings are Coming Up!

Nurse Erin will be conducting hearing and vision screenings on all of our students at Minooka Primary Center on **Nov 5-9. It is very important that your student attends** those days so he/she can be tested.

Hearing and vision screenings are an important part of our school program. Hearing or vision problems can occur at any age, and often our young students do not realize and/or can not express that they are having difficulties. Early detection of hearing or vision loss is essential so problems can be corrected and remediated before they get worse. Hearing is important for speech and language development, social skills, and learning acquisition. Young students are rapidly learning so much about the world around them and much of that information comes through the eyes. Children's eyes experience their greatest development- and vulnerability-during the first six years of life.

Please use this vision screening readiness game to prepare your child for the screening so we may be more effective in our screening process. We will be using the HOTV screening tool. A verbal response is not required, nor must the children know the HOTV letters. They simply will be conditioned to "match" the four symbols they see inside the machine by pointing to the response card.

A vision screening is not a substitute for a complete eye and vision examination by an eye doctor. If your child has had an audiogram or eye exam in the last 12 months, please send in a copy to school, and your child will not need to be screened. Please let your teacher or Nurse Erin know if you have any hearing or vision concerns with your child.



Directions – Cut or tear the H-O-T-V strip at the bottom of the page. Fold the strip so that the child only sees one letter at a time. Place the H/O/T/V picture in front of the child. Show one letter on the tear strip to the child and ask them to point to the same letter on the above square. Repeat with each letter one at a time and ask them to point to the matching letter in the square. The letter need not be called by name. Play the game for five minutes the first time and repeat several times for shorter periods before the vision screening.

H O T V

To be placed in any of our programs parents must sign up for an Early Learning Screening once your child is at or between the ages of 3-5.


